

Our last show of the season, *Seussical the Musical*, directed by Valerie Haas, will open on April 29 and runs through May 22. It caps off our family-friendly season here at the Guild. Adults and children alike will love seeing their favorite Seuss characters such as Horton the Elephant, Gertrude McFuzz, Mayzie the Bird, the Grinch, and the iconic Cat in the Hat. Don't miss your chance to see familiar faces, and some brand-new ones, too, strut their stuff on our stage.

One of the many high points of *Seussical* is the music, directed by **Paul Abbott**. From the upbeat ensemble number of "Oh, the Thinks You Can Think" to the haunting strains of "Alone in the Universe" and "Solla Sollew", the music of *Seussical* is full of complex harmonies and expressive solos. The music is constant through the entire show, all of the lines are spoken in rhythm, and while that was a challenging aspect for the cast at first, intense rehearsing has made the end product nothing short of fantastic.

Other can't-be-missed components are the extravagant sets, designed by **Kirk Haas** and worked on by the Scene Shop crew, the fantastic dance numbers, choreographed by **Janeen Bodary**, and the fanciful variety of costumes provided by our talented costuming committee. This entire show is a feast for the eyes and ears, which makes it a perfect event for all ages.

## TAKING TALENT on the Road...

At the Players Guild we are fortunate to have such talented members working both behind the scenes and onstage for all our productions. Though we love what we do right here at home, and we help keep the Arts alive by bringing audiences *in* to see our work, there are other creative ways our talents can be beneficial beyond the walls of the Guild. That's what happened with the recent production of *Murder Comes to Uptight Abbey*.

According to director and writer Brian Townsend, "the show came about from Randall Nicholls asking if I might put together a show for his church (who used to do shows once in a while in their past - I remember walking up there to see a friend of mine in The Velveteen Rabbit many many moons ago). I asked if there were any restrictions or preferences; namely, did it need to be biblical or religious? Randall said there were two Downton Abbey and murder mysteries. So I decided to kill two birds with one stone, as it were, and make a parody of both.

"The show started rehearsals in February and while we worked on act one, I was writing act two. We laughed at rehearsals a lot. In fact, some flubs during rehearsals led to great lines and additions to the script. We were very fortunate to have help from the Guild, not only with actors sharing their talents but our Governors lending advice, set pieces, props and costumes."

Numerous Guild members stepped up to make this happen. Nathan Booth was stage manager and worked lights and sound with Stan Guarnelo. Current Governors Inez Hernandez and Diane Cliff helped with costumes and props, respectively. Philip Booth aided in the schlepping of supplies, and Paul Bruce wrote and played the theme music. The collaboration and efforts culminated in a fundraiser on April 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> for the church's Youth Group Mission Trip to Ghost Ranch, New Mexico (an education and retreat center), and "over the twonight production, [they] raised \$5,633 (a total from seat/ticket sales and additional donations)." The members of Allen Park Presbyterian Church were extremely grateful, and Brian and the cast and crew "had a great time doing it!"
