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
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Julie Ballantyne Brown

My love for Agatha Christie began in the fifth grade, over forty years ago. Grandma Bartos would hand down the Queen of Mystery's novels to Mom, who handed them down to me. The shock of it all! A ten-year-old boy reading murder mysteries! To this day, I find myself turning to my oldest friends Hercule Poirot, Jane Marple, Ariadne Oliver, and Tommy and Tuppance.

When I have directed in the past, I always tried (and hoped) to bring the playwright's vision to the audience. In directing *Go Back for Murder*, I feel that I am a curator of the Queen of Crime's tradition of plot twists, red herrings, and, of course, surprise endings. While this is a daunting task, it does not occur in a vacuum. Bringing Dame Agatha's vision and traditions to life takes the hard work of many people.

This stunning cast brings to life some very rich characters. While some actors do this any time they appear on stage, this bunch of dedicated, yet hilarious, group of actors have put up with my madness for several weeks to bring you, our audience, a delicious murder mystery. Our set builders took crude drawings and feverish ideas and

> breathed life into a simply beautiful set. Properties added to that life. Costumes, hair, and makeup helped to further develop the characters you are about to meet. Our producers kept us all in line, on time, and on task. Thank you all!
