### A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

*Guys and Dolls* was the very first production I ever directed. I was nervous and a bit timid but it was in that show I found how much I loved being a director. To watch the vision in my head unfold before my eyes was exhilarating. *Guys and Dolls* is often called the "perfect, classic" musical. There's a reason for this - it is. So, to have the opportunity to direct *Guys and Dolls* once again, 27 years later, I was thrilled. I can't get the tunes out of my head! I am constantly singing the brilliant melodies and lyrics written by Frank Loesser. I know the audience will also hear those same songs in their heads long after the curtain falls. The music and lyrics are immediately recognizable and irresistible. Originating from a series of short stories by Damon Runyon, *Guys and Dolls* is a wonderful show filled with quirky dialogue and witty one-liners. Runyon's New York City no longer exists, but tonight we can return to the Big Apple where men were Guys, the women were Dolls, and the gamblers were not so threatening, only endearing.

So lay your cards on the table, relax and let this "winning bet" take you to the wonderful world of 1950's New York City. 
