

Welcome to the Players Guild of Dearborn and our production of A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder. This multiple Tony -award winning musical comedy just recently came off Broadway and we are extremely excited to be one of the first theaters in the area to perform it. We are continually striving to bring new and entertaining theater experiences to our audiences, and this show hits that mark. As you will see, A Gentleman's Guide is different than other shows we have performed. For starters, it's the first time we will be using projected images as scenery, instead of handmade drops (or flies) that have been used since the beginning of time. If you are a frequent theater goer, you may have noticed this trend where you see less crafted set pieces and more of an engaging "video imagery" that pulls the audience into the same places as the characters on stage. When we chose this show last year, we knew of this challenge and it became something we were really looking forward to undertaking. A lot of research and learning went into figuring out how this would be possible in our little space. Our dedicated stage crew was up to the task and between those individuals and this very talented cast, this adds up to be a spectacular show. Director Mike Moseley, and AD Janeen Bodary, have been working masterfully on the blocking and movement in this show, which in itself almost becomes one of the characters and is such an important element in the telling of this story. The music is fresh and original, while still seeming part of the period, and Steve Woznicki, who has been Music Director for several shows here at the Guild, once again shines through with his leadership of singing and arrangements.

There have been countless volunteer hours that have gone into bringing this show from idea to stage and I am grateful to all of those who have been a part of this. We are an all volunteer, non profit organization whose members have a love for arts and community experience. If you find you have a desire to be involved in the same way, look through this program for the various opportunities and ways you can get involved. On behalf of the cast, crew, and members of the Players Guild we thank you for your continued support and hope you enjoy the show.


Mission Statement

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

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Musical theater is perhaps the most inherently collaborative art form. What you are experiencing tonight, in our own Players Guild fashion, is a wonderful example of all that is true about this unique, form of theatre. I've been enchanted with musical theatre for more than 50 years and have had the good fortune to experience countless musicals as an audience member and performer for most of those years. A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder is the first time I have been privileged to direct a musical and it has proven to be an experience that confirms and celebrates everything I have come to believe is best about musical theater.

The Players Guild is privileged to be the first community theater in the area to stage A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder, the 2014 Tony Award-winning Best Musical. Our expression of this artistic collaboration starts out with an engaging story brought to life with witty and devious humor by Robert L. Freedman's Tony Award winning script and brought to musical life with Freedman's and Steven Lutvak's remarkable score. Then we added our own creative team, Music Director, Steve Woznicki and my Assistant Director and our Choreographer, Janeen Bodary. These two remarkable artists are the personification of the collaborative energy that it takes to bring a musical to life. They have been the most able and boundlessly inventive co-conspirators on this remarkable journey and have allowed all of us, cast and crew, to joyfully experience true creative partnership. The wonderful symphony of collaborative creativity is done by scores of hardworking, dedicated Guilders whose names you see elsewhere in this program. As representative of that group and out of heartfelt gratitude, I would like to call out a few names. Choosing a cast is the most important thing a director does, and I have been blessed with a group of some of the most dedicated, talented, generous people I have ever had the pleasure to work with. This cast is made up of many familiar faces and some new ones. Their work ethic and willingness to engage in imaginative play has energized and humbled me everyday we have been together. I am proud of the work they have done...you are in for a treat. And of course, all of what you see on the stage is being supported by our awesome stage crew...they are moving in the darkness backstage like a well-oiled machine!

All of these different talents come together to create a performance of what is the most quintessential American contribution to theatre...the musical. It is my sincere wish that you, the audience, the final and most important part of that experience, are able to enjoy this production of *A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder* as much as we have had in bringing it to you.


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




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
